Annual Report-2016-17 Part-I

HISTORY

The Allahabad Museum is centrally located in the Civil Lines area of the city in a lush green garden at Chandrashekhar Azad Park, popularly known as Company Bagh. It is about 3 kms away from the Allahabad railway junction and almost equidistant from three different railway stations such as Prayag, Rambagh and Allahabad junction and about 12 km away from Bamrauli Airport.

Background: In 1863, the Board of Revenue requested the Government of North-Western Provinces for the establishment of a public

including ancient sculptures from Bharhut and Bhumra as well as the art collections of Abanindranath Tagore, Jamini Roy, Gaganendranath Tagore, Asit Kumar Haldar of the Bengal School. Also the acquisition of the collection of paintings of European artists like Nicholas Roerich and Anagarik Govinda, a German monk whose collection enabled the museum to create galleries of modern art in the museum. In 1942, S.C. Kala the first curator gave the much needed impetus to enrich the collections of the museum, especially adding the Nehru Personalia Collection and as the

library and a museum. With donations from the provincial government, the famous Orientalist Sir William Muir and the Maharaja of Vijaynagaram, a superintendent of the library and museum was appointed and an ornate building was inaugurated in 1878 to house the collection. For unforeseen reasons or due to paucity of funds the museum was closed down in 1881. With the initiative of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the President of the Allahabad Municipal Board and Pt. Brijmohan Vyas efforts were made to establish a new museum in the city in the year 1923-24. It was under the operational direction of Pandit Brij Mohan Vyas, the executive officer of the board, a museum was opened in the Municipal Building in 1931. Under the tutelage of Pandit Vyas, the museum acquired important collections,

space became a constraint, it was decided that the museum should be shifted from the Municipal Board building to a new premise. The foundation stone of the present museum building was laid on 14th December 1947 by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and the museum was opened to the public in 1954 in the Chandra Sekhar Azad Park or the Company Bagh area. But the real turning point of the fate of the museum came in the year 1986. After realizing the significance of the diversity of its rich collections of archaeological artifacts, art treasures, the museum was taken over by the Ministry of Culture, Government of India after constituting an autonomous body called Allahabad Museum Society and declared it a museum of national importance under the Ministry of Culture. Government of India.

Presently the museum is under the financial control of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India and the ex-officio Chairman of the museum is the Governor of Uttar Pradesh.

ALLAHABAD MUSEUM SOCIETY

The Society shall consist of the following members:-

- (i) Chairman (shall be nominated by the Government of India for a period of five years).
- (ii) Financial Adviser of the concerned Ministry/Department of the Government of India.
- (iii) One representative of the Ministry/ Department dealing with matters concerning the Society.
- (iv) Eminent persons not exceeding five in number in the field of education, art and culture to be nominated by the Government of India. One of the nominees would be Commissioner of Allahabad Division.
- (v) One representative of Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.
- (vi) One representative from Department of Environment.
- (vii) Three representatives of State Government of U.P. including one belonging to the Finance Department of the State Government.
- (viii) Director, Allahabad Museum Member-Secretary.

MANDATE

The aims for which the Society is established are:-

- i) To take over the administration and management of the Allahabad Museum, Allahabad with all its assets and liabilities from the Municipal Corporation, Allahabad and to establish and maintain the Museum.
- ii) To organize, undertake, conduct, encourage and promote study and research in the field of museum

- development.
- iii) To acquire, maintain and preserve the art objects.
- iv) To collaborate with institutions/ organizations engaged in similar activities in India and abroad with a view to furthering the aims and objects of the Institution.
- v) To organize lectures, seminars, symposia, conferences in India and abroad commensurating to the development of the museum and to acquaint the young growing generation with the rich cultural heritage of the country.
- vi) To undertake all such activities as are incidentally necessary or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the museum activities.
- vii) To undertake and to promote publication of books, guide books and periodicals and papers incorporating the results of the studies and research carried out at the museum.
- viii) To collaborate for exhibition of the collections of the museum at different places in India and abroad.
- ix) To organize training courses in the field of conservation and preservation of art objects.
- x) To set up a mobile unit with audio-visual materials and other printed matter for taking the works of art and culture to schools and colleges and to other community centres.
- xi) To acquire and hold property provided that prior approval of the Central Government is obtained in the case of acquisition of property.
- xii) To construct or otherwise acquire, layout, repair, extend, alter, enlarge, improve and use any land, parks and any other immovable property belonging to or held by the Society.
- xiii) To render assistance to universities, institutions, museums schools and colleges or other bodies in planning and organizing museums.

- xiv) to obtain or accept grants, subscriptions, donations, gifts, bequests, benefactions, transfers of properties both movable and immovable from Government or from any persons or organizations for the purpose of the Society.
- xv) To maintain a fund to which shall be credited:
 - a) All moneys provided by the Central Government
 - b) All moneys received by the Society by way of grants, gifts, donations, benefactions, bequests or transfers and
 - c) All moneys received by the Society in any other manner or from any other sources.
- xvi) To pay out of the funds belonging to the Society or out of any particular part of such funds, the expenses, incurred by the Society from time to time including all expenses incidental to the formation of the Society and management and administration of any of the foregoing objects including all rents, rates, taxes, outgoings and salaries of the employees.
 - To give gratuities or charitable aid to the staff and other employees or exemployees of the Society or to their wives, children or their other dependents.
 - b) To make payments towards insurance and to form and contribute to provident and benefit funds for the benefit of persons employed by the Society.
 - c) To acquire, hold, mortgage and dispose of any property in any manner whatsoever for the purpose of the Society, provided that prior approval of the Central Government is obtained in case of acquisition or disposal of immovable property.
 - d) To deal with any property belonging to or vested in the Society in such manner as the Society may deem fit for advancing the functions of the

Society.

- e) To borrow and raise moneys with the prior approval of the Central Government with or without security or on the security of and mortgage charge or hypothecation or pledge over all or any of the immovable properties belonging to the Society or in any other manner what-so-ever for the purpose of the Society.
- f) To build, construct and maintain buildings and alter, extend, improve, repair, enlarge or modify including any existing buildings and to provide and equip the same with light, water, drainage, furniture and other things for the use of which such buildings are to be put or held in connection with objects of the Society.
- g) To construct or otherwise acquire, layout, repair, extend, alter, enlarge,


- improve and use any land, recreation or play grounds, parks and any other immovable property belonging to or held by the Society.
- xvii) To do all such lawful acts and things whether incidental to the powers aforesaid or not as may be requisite in order to furtherance of the objects of the Society.

No benefactions shall be accepted by the Society which, in its opinion, involves conditions or obligations opposed to the spirit and objects of the Society.

The Government may issue such directions to the Society as it may consider necessary for the furtherance of the objects of the Society and ensuring their proper and effective functioning and the Society shall carry out such directions.

Collection Management Part-II

About the collection

There are sixteen galleries in the Allahabad Museum. It houses a variety of collections which include Stone Sculptures, Terracotta, Miniature Paintings, Modern Paintings, Archaeological Objects, Coins, Arms and Armour, Textile, Manuscripts, Farmans etc. The collection also includes the archaeological artifacts and exquisite art objects from different parts of the country.

The Sculptural Art Collection comprising of an abacus of an Ashokan Pillar (3rd Century BCE), fifty- eight fragments of sculptures from the Bharhut Stupa (2nd Century BCE) including scenes from the Jataka stories, pillars, cross bars and coping stones are displayed in the Early Sculpture Gallery. Medieval Sculpture section is still more attractive and varied displaying the Vaisnava, Shakta, Saiva and Jaina images. It also has a rich collection of Miniature Paintings and Modern Art. The Miniature Paintings belongs to the Rajasthani, Pahari, Mughal and Company Schools of paintings. Paintings of Anagarika Govinda and those of the Russian artists Nicholas, Svetoslav Roerich occupy a pride place in the Modern Art Gallery. The Bengal School Collection comprises the work of Asit Kumar Haldar, Abanindranath Tagore, Gaganendranath Tagore, Nandalal Bose, Jamini Roy and Sudhir Ranjan Khastgir- these are the pride of the Allahabad Museum Collections. The Museum has an important Personalia Collection of Manuscripts and letters of literary luminaries like Sumitranandan Pant, Mahadevi Verma, Suryakant Tripathi 'Nirala', Maithili Sharan Gupta, Ram Kumar Verma and others. The Arms and Armours Collection of the Allahabad Museum has unique pistols, rifles, guns, swords and body armour from 18th Century to 19th Century CE including the Pistol of Chandrashekhar Azad showcased in the Central Hall. The Textiles and Decorative Art Collection includes fine gold zari work and

exquisite wooden artifacts. It also has a Natural History Section for the children visiting the Allahabad Museum.

Galleries

The galleries have an impressive collection of archaeological artifacts from the prehistoric times to medieval periods which include antiquities from copper hoard culture and late Harappan culture to the Late Medieval period of Indian history. The collections of Allahabad Museum are known for the rare Bharhut Art, Terracotta Collection, Miniature Paintings, Modern Paintings, Paintings of Bengal School of Art, Russian painter Nicholas Roerich, rare collection of Tibetan Thankhas, paintings of Asit Kumar Haldar and also the Pistol of Chandrashekhar Azad. Important objects of museum collection have been displayed in the following galleries of the Museum including one permanent gallery for temporary exhibitions. 

Preventive & Curative Conservation

In addition to routine fumigation, antitermite treatment and anti insecticidal treatment in termite prone zone & insect prone zone were done as and when desired by the curators. Conservation of a total of 918 objects including 602 stone sculptures, 154 paintings, 5 textiles, 5 Archival materials, 9 books and registers, 8 manuscripts (160 folios), 9 Metal Objects, 4 Thangka Paintings, 50 Copper coins, 7 Porcelain, 1 wooden object, 1 textile painting, 62 Literary objects and 7 Ivory objects were done during the period.

Digitization

The work of Digitization as well as physical verification of objects is regularly being done through Jatan Virtual Museum Builder Software in the Photography Laboratory since 2013. The Documentation of Terracotta (5838), Stone (1314), Miniature Painting (1657), Farmans (520), Thangka

(132), Manuscripts (5887), Coins (358), Archaeological collection (269), Archival (429), Beads (840), Bronze collection (75), Decorative Art (707), Freedom Struggle (2), Jewellery (107), Literary (158), Modern Painting (470), Nehru Collection (1412), Textiles (765) and wood work (50) was done. At the Operator level 21272, Curator level 16100 and Director Level 14000 entries of the objects have been uploaded in the web portal of the Ministry under the above scheme up to the month of March 2017.

Documentation

Besides coverage of all the activities like seminars, lectures, workshops, exhibitions, children's week, etc., during the period, the photo-documentation of the antiquities and art objects have been done under which 260 Beads and 193 Arm Collection objects were got photographed by the section. The objects before and after conservation were also photographed during the year.
